Button wrinklewort	<i>Rutidosia leptorhynchoides</i>	Endangered
Grassland earless dragon	<i>Tympanocryptis pinguicolla</i>	Endangered
Golden sun moth	<i>Synemon plana</i>	Endangered
Murray River crayfish	<i>Euastacus armatus</i>	Vulnerable
Scarlet robin	<i>Petroica multicolor</i>	Vulnerable
Small purple pea	<i>Swainsona recta</i>	Endangered
Smoky mouse	<i>Pseudomys fumeus</i>	Endangered
Two-spined blackfish	<i>Gadopsis bispinosus</i>	Vulnerable
Yellow box grassy woodland	An ecological community	Endangered
